² Instead of *International Studies/Peace and Conflict Research* subsequently the German abbreviation "ISFK" is used.

³ Instead of *Modern East Asian Studies* subsequently the German abbreviation "MEAS" is used.

⁴ Seminar: An advanced course on a Master level that teaches and provides scientific knowledge. Current problems are being discussed by applying scientific methods. Usually, active participation is mandatory and attendance can be restricted. If you only attend, you will gain 3 ECTS. If you take an exam/paper, you will gain 8 ECTS.

⁵ Kolloquium: A seminar where (advanced) students present and discuss their B.A. or M.A. proposals, research questions and/or findings (3 ECTS).

⁶ Kolloquium: A seminar where (advanced) students present and discuss their B.A. or M.A. proposals, research questions and/or findings (3 ECTS).
