How did we find you?

Your address was selected at random from the population register of the city or municipality in which you are registered. This procedure is permitted under § 46 of the Federal Registration Act in compliance with data protection regulations. We thus kindly ask you to participate in this survey.

How can you participate in the survey?

In the invitation letter that you received, you will find a **website link**, a **QR code** and a personal **login** located in this box. To participate in the survey, please either visit the website or scan the QR code, select a language and start the survey with your personal login.

What will the survey be about?

In the survey, we will ask about your personal opinions and experiences. Your participation is voluntary and should not take longer than 30 minutes. You can skip individual questions or stop the survey altogether at any time. This will not have any repercussions for you. We have included a 5 Euro note in your invitation letter as a small thank you for your participation in our survey.

What happens with your data?

Your answers to our questions will be analysed statistically and used for purely scientific purposes. The use of your data follows the legal data protection regulations. In particular, all answers will be treated as strictly confidential and only be used in anonymised form. Therefore, the answers you provided cannot be traced back to your person.
